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Introduction

2023 brought us into updating our training platform. We started using Paylocity for training staff and helping keep track of staff that need to complete training. We were able to record trainings for staff so staff can train at their desks. We still held in-person trainings but knowing all staff cannot attend, the Paylocity suite worked to help update the staff's training. The great thing about Paylocity, we can record our trainings, presentations and staff can view anytime. This saves in having to schedule a classroom and time for staff to attend an in-person make-up training.

This year we set up with 8 trainings, and staff only had to attend 1 instead of doing 4 quarterly trainings. We offered them during the day and on weekends to accommodate full-time and part-time staff. We only had a few remaining staff that had to make-up at the end of the year using Paylocity.

2023 PDRMA Loss Control

In 2023 we worked with PDRMA on a goal to increase our Injury Prevention Training. Looking at our injury statistics and where we need to focus on training, our Parks staff completed the training in June. The training was recorded and the Equestrian staff completed it in August. We also wanted to focus on vehicle safety and had staff signed up for Truck & Trailer training but it was cancelled in the fall. We do conduct our in-house trailer training in the spring with Parks Staff and send staff out for further training Working with PDRMA on the Slip Trip & Fall assessments for each facility, we found a new section on spill clean-up training for staff. This will be added to our trainings in 2024.

In 2023 with PDRMA's In2Vate software we completed Slip, Trip & Fall Assessments on all of the district facilities. One of the main things noted was the spill clean up training and materials at some facilities that

needed to be added or updated. The assessment covered everything from entryways, stairways, flooring material & lighting.

We did have an updated Infa-red inspection of the electrical panel at the Normantown Equestrian Center & everything was good. The last inspection was in 2000 and there were some issues that we had corrected.

In May we hosted a two-day chainsaw safety course with PDRMA. It was held at our river property at Renwick Road & the DuPage River. The class cut down 10 dead trees that we later removed and chipped.

In 2023 we received a \$500 grant award from PDRMA for purchasing a new 12ft. platform ladder. We also received a \$1,500 cash incentive for our loss prevention efforts and meeting the 2023 criteria for the Risk Management Review. This time it was broken into

3/\$500 checks. The first section was completing our initial review in February, the second step was setting our Injury Prevention training goal & the last step was completing the goal and submitting our completed goal checklist.

In 2024 we will continue to focus on our Injury Prevention training along with our added spill prevention & clean-up training. We will work with PDRMA on a new Smart Goal focusing on Injury Prevention and Ergonomics.
